




Message from the President

It has been proposed and the board has approved the following changes to the By-laws as it pertains to Charitable Donations. These changes must be approved by the membership at the June 7th meeting. Please see below for the current regulations and proposed changes:

Current

ARTICLE X Charitable Contributions

- Section 1. Recipients of monetary charitable contributions shall be limited to local Chicagoland chapters of 501 (c) (3) recognized charitable associations.
- Section 2. Requests for monetary charitable donations shall be presented to the Board of Directors for qualification. With a majority vote, the Board of Directors shall qualify such requests according to the precepts outlined in Article X, Section 1. If request is qualified, the Club treasurer shall advise the Board of Directors on the Club's availability of funds. If the request is deemed qualified and affordable by the Board, it will be presented to the membership at the next scheduled regular meeting and must be approved by 51% of the active members present and voting

Proposed

- Section 1. Recipients of monetary charitable contributions shall be limited to 501(c)(3) recognized charitable organizations.
 - A. No more than a total of five charities will be selected to be recipients of the Club's "excess funds".
 - B. Of the five selected charities, no more than One "National" charity will be selected to be beneficiaries of the Club's excess funds.
 - C. No one charity can be the beneficiary of the Club's excess funds more than two consecutive years.

Standard Operating Procedures

- At the October membership meeting, the Charity Committee will solicit the membership for nominations of charitable organizations to be beneficiaries of the Club's "excess funds" for the coming fiscal year.
- The nomination form will include: the organization name, address, website URL, contact information, verification of 501(c)(3) status and a brief description of the services/programs provided.
- 3. At the December Board meeting, the Board will select the charities to be the beneficiaries of the the Club's "excess funds" for the coming fiscal year. Those charities will be limited to one "National" charity and four "Local" charities. A National Charity is defined as one that provides programs and services in areas other than Chicago and the collar counties. A Local charity is one that provides programs and services primarily in Chicago and the collar counties.
- If more than one "National" Charity is nominated, one charity will be selected by a random process at the Board's discretion.
- If more than 4 "Local" charities are nominated 4 charities will be selected by a random process at the Board's discretion.
- If no "National Charities" are nominated, a maximum of 5 "Local" Charities will be selected by a random process at the Board's discretion.
- At the conclusion of each fiscal year, the Treasurer will inform the Board of the amount of "excess" funds available for donation to charitable organizations as outlined in Article X, Section 2 of the By-Laws.
- 8. The process outlined in Article 10, Section 2 will be followed to complete the process.

Greeting Sunburst Members,

Well summer is here at last and the warm Memorial Day weekend was a great way to kick off the season. With summer comes a number of Vette related events and activities and with those comes the chance of unfortunate events, like accidents.

One of the benefits of being an NCCC club is the liability insurance that is provided by virtue of your NCCC membership. Actually, for many clubs, the primary reason for affiliating with NCCC is the insurance coverage that comes with membership. There are all sorts of myths and misunderstandings about this coverage and I'm certainly not an expert, but I will try to summarize the information that's available on the NCCC website.

Who is covered?

Members holding a current NCCC membership number are covered under a \$1M General Liability Policy, \$4M Umbrella Policy, plus a Participant Accident Policy (\$25K AD&D and \$50K Medical. NCCC elected and appointed officers at the national, regional and club levels are covered under the Director and Officer Policy for \$2M plus \$4M against lawsuits. Officers are also covered under a Crime Policy for a variety of items, such as theft, forgery & fraud as long as it was not willfully done.

What events are covered by the NCCC insurance policy?

Official events which are organized and approved thru the Club, Region or National organizations and they have made their members aware of the event, thru: Minutes, e-mail blasts, Calendar, Newsletters, Website, Facebook, or other mass communication technology.

Spontaneous gatherings of club members for any reason, are not official events and are not covered by any NCCC insurance policy.

The coverage of the NCCC policy does not take the place of your personal automobile insurance and it is not intended to cover the comprehensive portion of your personal automobile policy. For more specific information regarding the coverage check out the Midwest Region website www.mwregion.com and click on the Competition Button, then at the bottom of the competition page, click on the link to NCCC Insurance information.



Wright Wride May 5 thru May 8, 2018

Our group experienced a busy 4-day (1,300+ mile) trip including stops in three states beyond Illinois, touring a car museum, a fabulous FLW home then topping the drive with candy and ice cream enjoyed right at the Dietsch Bros. factory.

But, have you ever seen car parts, tire remnants and trash on the highway and wondered about the danger? Well, six Sunburst cars now have first-hand experience and avoided a potential tragedy while driving the Ohio Turnpike only a few hours after touring Fallingwater. Unseen, but ahead of us, a camper or boat trailer lost an entire wheel assembly. A semi was struck, tearing off a step, damaging a fuel tank, fender and other areas. Rubble on the highway could not be entirely avoided. Jeanie Wiemelt's convertible was hit by debris, suffering a cracked windshield and body damage but her instinctive reaction prevented a disaster. The highway commission recovered the wheel assembly and mutilated step, State Police took a report. All cars were drive-able but we separated into two groups with 3 cars keeping close with Jeanie while the other two found a comfortable speed to smooth a shimmy one was experiencing. Alertness on the highway and divine intervention saved us.







Our drive to Fallingwater began with, what else, breakfast. This time at a Cracker Barrel in Tinley Park because the location was along our route where back-tracking to a gathering point by anyone was unnecessary.





By just being a Sunburst member one expects a commonality of interest in Corvettes. But the depth of experience and knowledge we each have opens worlds. As Wright Wride was in the planning phase, Ken Monroe reached to me with an offer - he was once an interpreter and guide of Wright homes in Oak Park. Who knew? His proposal was to personally lead us on a local tour before our trip. So this is when Wright Wride actually began, two weeks in advance, with a private tour of the Wright Home and Studio, then; Ken's interpretive walk along nearby streets where many of FLW's first commissions were constructed to experience the evolution of his style. Oak Park is a stunning community with not only Wright homes but many fine Victorian mansions. One point Ken made was that the Victorian style was then contemporary and those owners did not like what Wright was interjecting into their neighborhood. Think about that - today's walls of glass and open floor plans were a vision by Wright more than 100 years ago.

Then we were off to South Bend IN to tour the Studebaker Museum. This now defunct automobile manufacturer once employed more than 20,000, developed many automobile firsts but began in the 1880's as a farm wagon builder. Studebaker was the only company to successfully make the transition from horse drawn to horseless. Following lunch in the former library of the Studebaker mansion (now Tippecanoe Place), we then moved on to Auburn IN.

Saturday was Cinco de Mayo so Mexican was the dinner theme. A crowd at Cebolla's Mexican Grill was boisterous, the music loud and the food was good. Margaritas flowed, even back to the hotel.





After Sunday morning breakfast at Bob Evans, a personal favorite for the tour leader, we headed to PA and lodging nearby to Fallingwater. The Summit Inn is approximately 25 miles from Fallingwater and located in the hills of western Pennsylvania. Built in 1907, this is a surviving 94-bedroom, grand porch hotel of the era. Many noted celebrities, presidents and dignitaries have stayed in the inn and we dined in the Firestone Room, named for Harvey Firestone who guested here along with his friends Thomas Edison and Henry Ford. We had the most luxurious table set for 16 people – it was truly a dining experience. Stories abound of the Inn being haunted – all we know is strange spots appear in photographs taken of the stairway and Sharon Sanders heard her camera fall off the dresser during the night!



An early breakfast on Monday, then the drive to Fallingwater via country roads seemingly created for Corvettes; following mountain streams offering frequent sharp curves and hills - what a ride. Viewing Fallingwater on tour accomplishes what mere storytelling and photographs cannot convey. The house sits astride a waterfall and positioned such that it can be seen and heard from the cantilever terraces and inside. Window size and placement makes one forget they're indoors. Boulders along the stream have been left in their original place, then incorporated within the building. A stairway descends to the family swimming spot near the waterfall directly from the great room. A flat rock upon which the family sunned themselves became the fireplace hearth. The Kaufmann family who contracted with Frank Lloyd Wright to build them a weekend home on the property, knew the architect through their son who was an apprentice under FLW. Even during the Great Depression they were a family of means, as owners of a major Pittsburgh department store. There are many stories about working with the great architect known to be headstrong. They imagined their home being sited to view the waterfall. At a time when a very nice home cost \$5,000 they commissioned, and attempted to control, Wright with a \$30,000 budget. What he delivered cost \$150,000, and they paid him! It is considered one of FLW's finest examples, built for one specific site and for the lifestyle of one specific client. Fallingwater was donated to the Western Pennsylvania Conservancy in the 1960's with the entire contents in place to be preserved. It is the most complete FLW structure anywhere.



On to our final destination, Findlay OH for Italian theme dinner at Rossilli's where we met up with Kris Jensen and her cousins who had arranged a tour for us the following morning. With the delay along the highway following the incident, several decided to stop earlier for dinner.





A Candy and Ice Cream factory tour of Dietsch Bros. began at 9 AM, Tuesday. Dietsch Bros. hand makes an incredible variety of candy, mostly chocolate. Through Kris' family connection, many at Sunburst have already enjoyed their chocolate at events during our 40th Anniversary celebration. A very interesting and informative tour and wonderful samples. We experienced hand rolled, hand dipped, individual hand marked truffles and chocolate dipped pretzels. Oh, did I mention they make ice cream too. Of course purchases from their store were safely transported home via dry ice in our coolers. What impressed me is how much hand work is involved in making fine candy and ice cream and how involved the owners are in actually working every phase. A small business of 75 employees and 80 years in the family. Kris will be moving to Findlay and joining the family business in retirement!







After the tour, our route was toward home. We found Jiggs Root Beer Stand in Defiance OH where they still have car hops after more than 60 years and stopped for lunch – homemade root beer and hot dogs! We begin and conclude with food.

Planning for Wright Wride began after Marilyn and I toured Taliesin West in Scottsdale AZ a year ago and decided we wanted to re-visit Fallingwater. By creating a club trip, friends were able to share our appreciation of architecture, especially that of Frank Lloyd Wright. The trip was divided with side-trips to break the drive while offering a variety. There is so much to see in the USA and for those able to join us, hopefully something from their Bucket List has been experienced.




